Saturday, March 31 - North Tract, east Laurel, Anne Arundel County

Trail Ride [Rain date: Saturday, April 20.] The North Tract of the Patuxent Wildlife Refuge (the only Fish and Wildlife property to allow horseback riding, thanks to TROT members turning out en masse several years ago) has impressively sturdy trails, with a packed-stone base originally designed for military tanks. Thus, this is one of the few area venues to ride without causing trail damage when the ground is soaked. [See May 2013 TROT newsletter.] Our ride will cover much of the almost 10 miles of rather scenic, hard-packed dirt/gravel woods trails. They are flat with no stream crossings, so good for out-of-shape and/or green horses, and are generally soft enough for bare-footed horses. We will have an all-walk group and a walk/trot group, possibly also doing a few controlled canter runs. After the $\sim 2\frac{1}{2}$ hr ride, we will enjoy a pot-luck lunch, so bring something yummy to share and a chair

TROT Safety Seminar

TROT's Events Committee (Corinne Pouliquen, Meggan Whalen, and Carolann Sharpe) organized their first event, "Trail Rider Safety and First Aid Seminar", held Saturday, January 12th. The seminar was extremely informative, well-organized, and professionally run, with great speakers. Attendance was more than expected.

The first speaker was Riley Schwengel, Park Ranger at Patuxent River and Seneca State Parks. He gave us a lot of useful information about trial safety: the importance of planning ahead, including downloading the trail map onto your cell phone, taking along your cell phone, a first aid kit, a whistle, and the 24/7 DNR emergency number (410-260-8888).

The next speaker was Darren Potter and his spouse Heather Hardesty, both EMTs who provided a lot more useful information on what to have in a first aid kit in your trailer and a smaller one with you in a fanny-pack on your person. It was nice to hear his accolades to duct tape and baling twine.

Next was a very interesting talk by Larry Raskin, TROT Search and Rescue (TROT-SAR), who has decades of expertise. He reinforced the importance of taking along what the previous speakers had advised. He also suggested a 55 gallon plastic trash bag that could be used as an emergency rain poncho/shelter and teaching your horse to led by the bridle, ponied; tied on a picket line or ground stake.

Neil Agate, President of the Maryland Horse Council, gave a short talk about the MHC, which included taking over the Equiery. Neil also spoke about METS (Maryland Equine Transition

After lunch Priscilla Huffman and Jo Ann Bashore spoke on the Volunteer Mounted Patrol and how to join.

Kerry Murphy, DVM of Clover Vet Service in Eldersburg provided a lot of extremely valuable veterinary information including the danger of using both Bute and Banamine together and the value of "sugardyne" (sugar-saturated betadyne) to draw out wounds.

The final talk was Kathleen Tabor, Esq., an attorney with great expertise in equine-related law and a real knack on explaining to the lay person legal matters that actually are very important to us horse-owners such as "contributory negligence", "good Samaritan laws", and the "attractive nuisance doctrine".

Our many thanks go to Neil Agate, President of the MHC, for kindly arranging for the excellent facilities as well as all our speakers who volunteered their time to prepare and present valuable information to us.

Passport booklets are being sold for \$10 each. Any TROT member in good standing can compete in this fiscal year event. There are 24 counties in Maryland. For the adventurous types, this passport book also includes a few places in Pennsylvania, Virginia, and Washington D.C.

The rider(s) who attend(s) the most TROT rides within a fiscal year wins an award*, and the worker(s) who record(s) the most trail work hours within a fiscal year wins an award*.



*Awards are determined by the TROT Board & distributed each year at the Annual Banquet. TROT Trail Ride-Have the ride leader initial & date the location in the passport book. Attendance will be verified by the ride sign-in sheets given to the TROT Trail Rides Committee Chair.

Trail Work-Self initial & date the location in the passport book. Record hours for yourself, and with the TROT Adopt a Trail Program Committee Chair, who will verify hours worked.

Don't see a TROT ride or work day you want. Coordinate one! There are plenty of blank spaces to add on additional rides and trail work!

Passport booklets need to be mailed by December 31, 2019 to TROT, PO Box 506, Highland, MD 20777 to be eligible for prizes at the 2020 TROT Annual Meeting and Banquet.
